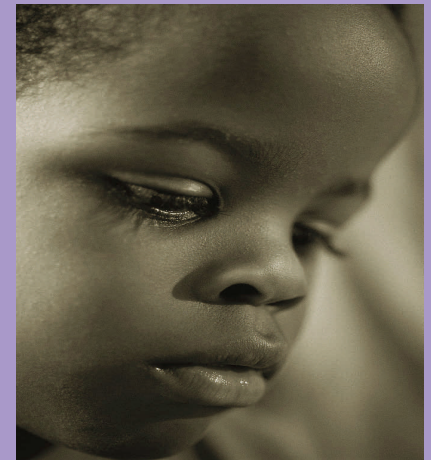

Session I

Trauma and Young children

(6 CEUs)

Presenters: Kay Connors, LCSW-C

Trauma and its impact can have a devastating effect on those exposed. Young children are particularly more vulnerable than others and lack the ability to effectively manage their reactions to trauma. This workshop will provide mental health professionals with a better understanding of key factors related to trauma. Participants will learn about the impact of trauma on young children as well as how to begin to address the negative influence it has on their lives.

Session II

November 9, 2007 (9 am– 4:30pm)

Assessment of the Young Child

(6 CEUs)

Presenters: Joyce Harrison, MD

Assessment is essential to any therapeutic process. Often times in clinical practice, young children are forced into diagnostic criteria that are not intended for them. For professionals working with young children, it is important to have knowledge of child development and the ability to identify areas of development which require support. This session will assist in specializing in the skills needed to more appropriately make an accurate assessment of children ages birth to six.

Session III

February 15, 2008 (9– 1:30pm)

Cultural Competency; The Value of Diversity

(4 CEUs)

As the population of young children and families served in Early Childhood Mental Health become increasingly more diverse, there is an expectation that mental health professionals are aware of the various background, beliefs, and morals which may impact their practice. Participants will be educated on the components of the service models available to more effectively meet the needs of diverse populations.
